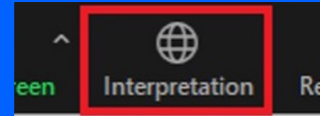

- Up to 23 voting members and one non-voting ex- officio member (UNOPS)
- 2 members are 'unaffiliated' + possibly the Chair
- Each Board Member will have an Alternate
- Constituencies select their representatives per criteria provided in Bye-Laws
- Subject to process of each constituency, government or organization - two-year terms, renewable once
- At least half of voting members from malaria affected countries

Role and accountabilities

- Governing body of the Partnership
- Largely representative model accountable to the global community and especially to people living in communities affected by malaria
- Provides oversight, support and strategic direction to the Secretariat and the Partner Committees and these mechanisms report to the Partnership Board
