RBM PARTNERSHIP TO END MALARIA

Nomination and Selection Pack for RBM Advocacy and Resource Mobilization Partner Committee (ARMPC) Co-chairs

Background

Since 1998, the RBM Partnership to End Malaria (formerly Roll Back Malaria) has been central to the global fight against malaria. The past twenty years have seen tremendous gains in reducing the burden of disease and progressing towards malaria elimination.

Since 2000, working in global partnership and solidarity, we have made historic progress against malaria, saving an estimated 7.6 million lives, preventing over 1.5 billion new malaria infections, and setting the world on a path to end the disease once and for all. As the global, multisectoral platform for coordinated action to end malaria, the RBM Partnership's work will be instrumental in achieving the ambitious 2025 and 2030 malaria reduction and elimination targets and milestones, as well as Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

The RBM Partner Committees are intended to formalize, consolidate and amplify the Partnership priorities of advocacy, resource mobilization, and country/regional support. The work of these Partner Committees is expected to align with the priorities outlined in the Global Technical Strategy 2016-2030 and Action and Investment to Defeat Malaria (AIM) 2016-2030, as well as with the Partnership Strategy and Annual Budget and Workplans.

The RBM Partner Committees (PCs) are:

- Advocacy & Resource Mobilization
- Country/Regional Support
- Strategic Communications

This document provides an overview of the nomination and selection process for one ARMPC Co-chair.

The deadline for receipt of nominations is Monday, 19 April 2021
with the nomination and selection process due to conclude by Friday, 7 May 2021.

Overview of Eligibility, Roles & Responsibilities, Skill Requirements and Selection Criteria

Eligibility

Any person working or with significant experience in the field of global health and/or development, including both public and private sectors, and committed to the RBM Partnership vision is eligible to be considered for the role of a Partner Committee Co-chair. The Co-chairs should be prominent leaders in the global malaria community and/or individuals who are able to ensure consistent resourcing of the Partnership mechanisms or global efforts to fight malaria.

Roles & Responsibilities

- Working with the relevant Partner Committee Manager, other PCs, and the CEO, and under guidance from the Partnership Board, develop budgets and workplans for the Partnership Board to approve. The work plan will include strategic priorities, and how results will be measured and reported to the Partnership Board.
- Work with relevant Partners, the Management Team and the Partnership Board to mobilize required
 finances and resources to implement PC priorities. (It is envisaged that the PC workplans may not
 necessarily be funded centrally but will mobilize & leverage additional resources).
- Convene teams as required for the execution of agreed workplans from among the PC members and the broader Partnership, ensuring a balanced geographic representation, relevant skills and experience and capacity/time commitment.
- Working with the relevant PC Manager, oversee the work of the Committee to implement the approved workplans.
- Work with other PC Managers and Co-chairs to ensure the alignment and complementarity of PC workplans and relevant cross-cutting activities.
- Report annually to the Partnership Board on the progress of the approved workplans, or more frequently if required by the Partnership Board.
- Commit sufficient time to the Partnership which may vary by Committee leadership ToR but will be
 expected to constitute no less than 25% FTE to allow full implementation of the agreed workplans.

Skills

- Ability to solicit input from a wide range of stakeholders and ensure that input is included in Committee discussions.
- Ability to lead and manage a diverse group of people, ensuring that open communication is maintained, and all voices are heard.
- Possession of excellent communication skills and a history of written and spoken communication related to global health.
- Ability to work effectively with the Management Team, to include an understanding of basic financial principles.
- High level of expertise in the subject matter of the ARMPC.
- High level of personal integrity and ethics, and a demonstrated commitment to inclusiveness and diversity.

Specific requirements for ARMPC Co-chair

- Significant experience developing and leading global resource mobilization initiatives and strategies.
- Significant experience developing and leading global advocacy strategies.
- Understanding of global decision-making structures and frameworks and a strong established network.
- Experience of estimating resource needs by sub-region and region for the immediate and longer-term needs for a malaria free world.
- Experience of identifying resource mobilization opportunities.
- Good understanding of malaria and the wider development context.

Nomination and Selection Process

Candidates may be nominated by RMB Partners. Any individual is encouraged to self-nominate if s/he has the required skills and experience and is willing to commit the time required.

The nomination form is attached in **Annex 1**. Nominations should be sent to RBM Board Affairs at BoardAffairs@endmalaria.org.

In their nomination of candidates, all individuals and nominating partners and groups need to ensure that due regard is paid to the above criteria and to ensure that all nominees:

- a) Agree to their names being put forward.
- b) Are prepared to serve on the PC and to attend all meetings either in-person, by videoconference or teleconference.
- c) Recognize that they are only being nominated and that selection for the PC Co-chair is subject to the recommendations of the PC and approval by the Partnership Board.

Selection Timeline

- i) 16 March 2021: Formal call for nominations published on RBM website: https://endmalaria.org/
- ii) 19 April 2021: Nominations close
- iii) By 19 April 2021: Evaluation and shortlisting of candidates by ARMPC
- **iv)** By 26 April 2021: RBM Secretariat Board Affairs Team reviews the shortlisted candidates' nominations and presents them to the Partnership Board for final selection and approval
- v) 6-7 May 2021: The new Co-chair of ARMPC is approved at the RBM Board meeting
