PURPOSE OF MIP WG

Align RBM partners on best practices and lessons learned in MiP programming to help achieve higher coverage in MiP interventions globally.

Promote and support WHO strategy to control MiP:
Insecticide treated bed net use (ITN)
Effective case management
Intermittent preventive treatment (IPTp) in areas of moderate to high malaria transmission

MiPATA GLANCE

<u>In 2020:</u>


- **34% of** pregnancies in SSA countries were exposed to malaria infection (**11.6 million pregnancies**)
 - 819,000 infants born with low birthweight
 - 164,000 stillbirths in 2019 (20% of stillbirths in SSA)
- 49% of pregnant women sleeping under an ITN
- 32% of eligible pregnant women received the recommended 3+ doses of IPTp
- 17% of women attending ANC1 do not receive any IPTp

- Attending ANC at least once - IPTp1 - IPTp2 - IPTp3




